Term 4 will commence on Tuesday 5 October, as Monday 4 October is a public holiday.

As of today, the plan for term 4 is that the first three weeks of term will continue to be learning from home, with attendance onsite of children from essential workers only. Again, minimal staff will be onsite to supervise these students. The Department of Education has developed a plan to bring students back in a COVID-safe way while stay at home orders are still in place – ensuring continuity of education, and protecting student, teacher and community safety. Up to date advice is also available on the public DoE website (Advice for families). The department recognises that both Kindergarten and Year 1 student have not had a full year of learning at school, due to the disruptions of the pandemic. Therefore, they are prioritised to return first. This is very much dependent on the state reaching a safe vaccination rate and low cases in our own Local Government Area.

The plan states:

- From 25 October Kindergarten and Year 1
- From 1 November Year 2, 6
- From 8 November Year 3, 4, 5,

Premier Gladys Berejiklian said the NSW Government is prioritising the safety and education of students through a sensible and managed return to school.

We will continue to update you as more information comes our way.

At all times the school adheres to the directives given by the Department of Education and the advice they receive from NSW Health.
