Students Not Returning 2025

As the year draws to an end, I am aware some families will be moving out of the area onto new and exciting adventures and their children therefore will no longer be attending Pitt Town Public School. Road Safety Update

There has been correspondence received from the Hawkesbury Council informing the school that the proposal for a raised pedestrian crossing on Buckingham Street will be considered in March 2025, for the 2025/2026 financial year. Our State Member Parliament the Honourable Robyn Preston has taken my concerns to the Minister for Roads, the Honourable John Graham and I will inform the community when I receive a response. We

have applied for a School Crossing Supervisor via the Transport for NSW program and are currently awaiting the result of this request. I encourage parents to consider using our back gate entrance on Fernadell Drive for morning drop offs. A lot of parents are currently choosing to walk their children across the road. I also ask that when parents are driving around the school, that extra care is taken.

Selective High School 2026 (Current Year 5 students) and Opportunity Class Placement 2026 (Current Year 3 students)

Parents of current Year 5 students are able to apply for a selective high school placement for their child who will be in Year 7 in 2026. Parents of current Year 3 students are able to apply for an opportunity class placement for their child who will be in Year 5 in 2026. Those wishing to do so, must apply within the dates below.

The key dates are:

- * Thursday 7 November 2024: Online applications OPEN
- * Friday 21 February 2024: Online applications CLOSE
- * Friday 2 May to Sunday 4 May 2025: Selective high school and opportunity class placement tests conducted over a 3-day period
- * Thursday 31 July 2025: Selective high school placement outcome expected to be released
- * Friday 29 August 2025: Opportunity class placement outcome expected to be released




Maths Spectacular
