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
# Term 1 March 2024

HERE IS WHAT WE HAVE BEEN LEARNING ABOUT IN TERM 1



#### MORNING KICK OFF

As a part of our morning routine, the students start off each day with phonemic awareness, phonics and writing practice.

#### MATHEMATICS

In Term 1, we have been learning about combinations of five, length, volume, capacity and mass! Lots of our maths work is done using hands-on, exciting activities. One of the students' favourite activities this term was a capacity lesson where we used water and different measuring mechanisms to fill buckets in a team relay!

#### **Culture Dose for Kids**

is a free arts engagement program for young people (aged 9 to 12) with mild anxiety - and their parent or carer.

Anxiety itself is a normal emotion. However, some young people worry more than others. In this project, mild anxiety refers to children who worry a little more than their peers but are not diagnosed with an anxiety disorder.

Parents/carers play a vital supporting role and they are invited to participate in the program at the same time, in a different part of the gallery space.

This program is modeled on the successful pilot at the Art Gallery of NSW.

The Culture Dose for Kids program seeks to understand the impact of arts engagement on the wellbeing in 9-12 year olds who experience mild anxiety.

A free program for their parents and caregivers will run at the same time.

The program will provide a friendly, safe, structured space for young people and their carers to engage with and respond creatively to curated artworks in a small group setting. It is led by an experienced team.

#### Who can participate?

Young people will be eligible to participate if they:

- Are between the ages of 9 to 12
- Are in primary school
- Are able to travel to Hawkesbury Regional Gallery
- You (the parent or caregiver) believe your child experiences mild anxiety
- Up to 15 young people plus a parent/carer

#### What's involved?

- Completion of a questionnaire
- Travel to Hawkesbury Regional Gallery each week for a 2-hour workshop
   starting Sunday 12 May and finishing on Sunday 30 June
- Take part in a short interview about your experience of the program.
