PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Parents and Carers,

It is hard to believe that Term 3 is coming to an end already, however, it has flown by, partly because of all the different engaging events that have occurred for the students' learning over the term. I wish everyone a safe and enjoyable holiday break, with the chance to reset for the final term of 2024 that commences with our Maths Spectacular day on Monday 14 October. Please make sure you have a read at the end of the newsletter of all the exciting activities the students have engaged within STEAM lessons recently as well as items that are required for Term 4 that you may be able to supply.

#### **Online Guardians**

The Online Guardians Sessions that were run for students and parents were very successful. Nathan connected with the students using their language and made it clear to them that it was not about taking away their devices, but rather helping them to make sensible decisions to keep them safe online, as well as using technology moderately to help to maintain a healthy and balanced lifestyle. Students and parents were both shown how simply playing a game of Roblox online can quickly escalate to an unsafe person knowing where you are living due to tricks used to get the young person onto another platform, through the use of gifts in the games. Nathan then provided the education around the best methods to protect yourself or children online to minimise the risks and potential of danger. Prior to the sessions, our students had completed surveys that covered how our students use devices and behave online. Although none of our students meet the age requirements to use Snapchat, 40% of our Stage 3 students are using this app. The state average for students using Snapchat in Stage 3 is only 20%. I encourage parents to consider this fact and although we have a significantly higher than state average for Snapchat use, there are still 60% of our students who are not using it. Often our children will beg us to have something they want with the comment of 'everyone else has it'. This is not always the case, as a parent it is our job to make decisions that our children may not always like, but it is to protect them and give them boundaries.

You would be aware that currently the Australian Federal Government is strongly considering raising the age of children in Australia being able to access social media to 16 years of age and have recently run a nationwide survey seeking community feedback.

What's been happening in STEAM this term?

During Term 3, students from Stages 2 and 3 explored the unit "The Student Film Maker" Term 3, 2024





This term we were introduced to video making and editing skills using the film making kit from Stem T4L.

Each kit contained professional equipment such as tripods, iOgraphers, Gimbal recorders, microphones and peripheral devices to help us achieve our learning intentions to become filmmakers!

Stage 3 were set the challenge to create a mini movie showcasing their upcoming Mini Fete stall.



Stage 2 were tasked with designing and recording a short film aimed at introducing new students to Pitt Town Public School. Each group chose their focus of a welcome video, sport related or creative activities.





































Our movies took 6 weeks of planning using storyboards, lots of talking, working as a team and time to reflect and edit using iMovie.

We learnt so many new skills about camera techniques such as panning, zooming in and out, slow-mo and time-lapse and how to use the editing software to publish our work.







While we were filming, we needed to demonstrate being respectful, responsible and safe digital citizens. A big part of this involved asking consent when filming. We learnt to respect a person's choice not to be in our film and became flexible and creative videographers because of it!
